

V. MUTT LECTURESHIP

History

The Viktor Mutt lectureship has been established in recognition of the fundamental research of Viktor Mutt in the field of gastrointestinal peptide hormones and neuropeptides. The first Victor Mutt lecture was given in Santa Barbara, 1994 (to Thue Schwartz). Subsequent recipients have been Alan Kopin (Copenhagen, 1996), Daniel Drucker (Macinac Island, 1998), Tim Wang (Cairns, 2000), Nigel Bunnett (Boston, 2002), Richard Benya (Toulouse, 2004), Masayasu Kojima (Hakone, 2006), Herbert Herzog (SantaBarbara, 2009), Jonathan Sweedler (Belfast 2010), Fiona Mary Gribble (Copenhagen, 2012), Mario Delgado (Kyoto, 2014), Matthias Tschöp (Rouen, 2016) and Laura Bohn (Acapulco, 2018).

Conditions

The nominee should be an active investigator who has made substantial contributions in the field of regulatory peptides and/or related topics. The nomination should adequately describe the research of the individual (a maximum of 5 pages), accompanied by a list of major publications and a complete curriculum vitae.

Submission as a PDF document must be sent to the chair of the selection committee (david.vaudry@univ-rouen.fr) **before September 2nd**. The recipient of the award must agree to come and participate to the *VPAC ISBAP 2022* congress that will take place in Osaka (Japan) from October 30th to November 2nd, 2022.

Award

Selection will be made by the steering committee of the International Society for Bioactive Peptides (ISBAP) and the results will be communicated before the end of September 2022.

The recipient will be invited to give a lecture at the symposium, will receive a diploma and will be offered the sum of 2000 euros in expenses by the journal PEPTIDES.
